How she seduced the Queen in a moment of weakness and had to leave in disgrace? I know you didn't seem surprised by this in your letter. I'm beginning to think she tells it to everyone she wants to seduce. Well, her replacement in the Elite Guard, Lorick, is just as stuffed up his own butt as Siofra. Is that inevitable? Am I going to end up like that when I'm a knight? Anyway, I learned this when he came into town on important business. We

2 SCENE 2 - SIOFRA, SAJA

CRACKLING FIRE, MURMURING PUB

SIOFRA
(confident, sex-obsessed
warrior woman)
So then I say, Sure, but which one
of you is the priest? Ha!

were at Lily's bar, like every

night, working hard...

SAJA

(adventure-loving princess)

Ha! Very amusing!

SIOFRA

Hey, I ever tell you about my deep dark tragic past?

SAJA

No! What happened?

SIOFRA

Well, I don't like to brag, but I used to be in the king's personal Elite Guard. Nothing special, you know, it's just what came of winning every duel I was challenged to, banishing the Witch of the Dust, bringing the Gloom Dragon to heel, and filling out an application and making sure to call back within a few days to show I was interested in the position.

SAJA

I heard about that application. Three professional references, that's not easy to come by on short notice.

SIOFRA

Just so. I was hob-nobbing every day with rich folks in the capital, you wouldn't believe how the other half lives - not that you don't seem like a lady of fine upbringing, but people out there are on a whole other level. No offense.

SAJA

None taken.

SIOFRA

Me and the queen had a special sort of friendship, you know? We didn't speak a lot but just from glances across a ballroom I learned a lot about her. She was almost as uncomfortable with the revelries of wealth as I was.

Allies in a world you weren't entirely comfortable inhabiting. I hear the queen was from a middle-class family.

SIOFRA

You're as sharp as you are adorable. Well, one day, when the King was away, she summoned me to her chamber, having heard of my prowess in keeping company with scores of women of lesser rank. But we were interrupted when -

DOOR OPENS

3 SCENE 3 - SHERIFF, SIOFRA, SJA, LORICK, MILLIA

CRACKLING FIRE, MURMURING PUB

SHERIFF

(A movie cop)
Siofra! Straighten up. There's
business afoot.

SIOFRA

Sorry, my story of the interruption has been interrupted. This had better be big, Sheriff.

SHERIFF

Your highness, I'm sorry for leaving you with my deputy. I hope Siofra hasn't made a nuisance of herself.

SAJA

Not at all.

(beat)

Siofra, I'm sorry for not properly introducing myself. I was wondering if you'd recognize me in plainclothes. Princess Saja Orelia, at your service.

SIOFRA

Princess!

LORICK

(heroic but condescending
knight in arms)
 (MORE)

LORICK (CONT'D)

Be quiet, both of you. We don't know where our enemies may lurk.

SHERIFF

I'm telling you, we keep this town safe and quiet.

(whispering)

Don't tell him about the demons, Siofra, I'm angling to be legally recognized as a person again.

SAJA

You relax, Lorick. I'm now supping with three of the nation's finest officers, whether or not we officially recognize your existence anymore.

SHERIFF

(Zoidberg)

Rub some salt in it, why not?

LORICK

My lady, the Sheriff and I were just discussing security for tonight's ceremony.

SIOFRA

What ceremony? Has the royal family joined a cult again? I'm not up to duel another elder god.

LORICK

It's need-to-know, Siofra. It's hard enough trusting you to keep knowledge of the princess's presence here a secret from every stripper and milkmaid you encounter.

SIOFRA

I don't hang out with a lot of milkmaids. Fine, you have my secrecy, but my squire will be helping with security as well. She's candid, faithful, and she's been listening to us this whole time anyway.

MILLIA

Sorry, polishing swords got boring.

SIOFRA

That's not a euphemism. Polishing swords is helpful for, uh, learning how swords... work.

LORICK

I'll bet it is. Now, while we search the cathedral, you're going to take five of my men into the woods, keeping your paws far away from the Princess. We have reason to believe there are pirates in the region.

MILLIA

What reason?

LORICK

We saw them. Their airship must be moored somewhere nearby.

SHERIFF

Smart money is to the south. Wide, open spaces. Plus the brothel used to be out there.

LORICK

When you find them, you are to leave no survivors.

SIOFRA

Leave no survivors from me and my squire encountering an entire crew of sky pirates, with all their cannons handy?

LORICK

That's unless you think it's too dangerous.

SIOFRA

Who do you think you're talking to? Your highness, do you have any requests? Should I do it barehanded? Blindfolded? Nude?

MILLIA

Please ignore her, your highness.

LORICK

Yes, your highness. I couldn't have put it better myself. Now, we must get ready.

4 SCENE 4 - SIOFRA, MILLIA, HELENA

PASTORAL TOWN. OCCASIONAL HORSE-CARTS.

NARRATOR-MILLIA

So Siofra and I quickly armed ourselves and began our quest.

SIOFRA

The nerve of that Lorick guy. Who does he think he is, talking to me all condescending?

MILLIA

I can see how that would wear on your nerves, my liege.

SIOFRA

It's like he thought I was gonna seduce the princess or something.

MILLIA

I'm baffled how he could have gotten that impression.

SIOFRA

I've known her since she was like fifteen! Sure, she's had a growth spurt since then, but she's still not my type.

MILLIA

So before you knew who she was--

SIOFRA

Innocent flirtation, like you do with anyone new you meet.

MILLIA

I'll bet you do.

SIOFRA

I don't have to take this.

HELENA

(flirtatious, loves
 Siofra, but secretly
 plots the destruction of
 all humans)

Hey, cats.

SIOFRA

Helena! What brings you back to town on such a fine day?

HELENA

I've just been to the market. Who was that girl you were drinking with?

SIOFRA

It's a secret. Uh, not like a, uh - she's just a kid, don't be gross. It's a state secret. I'm basically a secret agent.

HELENA

So secret they officially declared you nonexistent.

SIOFRA

Well I'm not going to get anything done as a secret agent if everyone trumpets it from the rooftops!

HELENA

I'll let you get back to your vital mission. Let's get lunch sometime.

SIOFRA

It would be my, uh, my pleasure.

5 SCENE 5 - MILLIA, SIOFRA, SUSAN

WOODLAND, STREAMS, BIRDSONG

NARRATOR-MILLIA

So Siofra managed to untie her tongue and we set off. The path to the cliffs looked completely different in the daylight. It was as different as night and day. We trekked through the farmland south of town in search of the pirates, and before long, with our tracking skills and the pirates disinterest in secrecy, we found them.

Before us, through a line of trees, a ramshackle collection of metal and canvas coiled around a clearing, like a sleeping cat. Scores of pirates of all shapes and sizes tinkered with the skeletal airship but one lookout saw us - Siofra wasn't exactly bothering to lay low.

(MORE)

5

NARRATOR-MILLIA (CONT'D)

Newbie pirates were like breakfast cereal to her - crunchy, but still, uh, something you eat for breakfast.

One woman stepped out from the hustle and bustle of work and with a WHOOP call across the camp they all circled us. The women stared us down as unimpressed as you might stare at, uh, breakfast cereal. I shouldn't write letters before I've eaten in the morning.

SUSAN

(just, the toughest
 motherfucker ever)
What have we here? A duet of prey.
Nuclear Wing Company D, at your
surprise.

MILLIA

That's -at your service.-

SUSAN

Darn right you are.

SIOFRA

Millia, these might not be the kind of wusses I was expecting.

(to Susan)

Nuclear Wing? Last I heard you guys had been killed by demons.

SUSAN

Hope springs eternal, eh? We were routed, sure. They caught us with our pants down, and their boss had some kind of magic protecting her, but I daresay if we ran into each other again things would go very differently.

SIOFRA

That could be arranged. I'd like to propose a truce. Or a trade, information for safety. Our town needs to deal with these demons just as badly as you need revenge.

SUSAN

That sounds reasonable. Of course, instead of this trade, we could simply torture you until you tell us where to find the demons, slaughter them in their beds, and then descend on your town in a rain of pillaging and bloodshed.

MILLIA

We could just tell you the location with no need for torture.

SUSAN

You seem to have misunderstood our motivation. We're the Nuclear Wing Company D, the scourges of the sky, the single greatest reason commercial air travel is not a feasible enterprise.

I am Captain Susan the Thirteenth, sole survivor of the Devil's Grail. I held Gryan, the city of whores, in such fear that they elected me mayor... unanimously. I am no one to screw with. Investigate my bona fides if you wish, but it may cost you your life.

SIOFRA

(quietly, lustily) Scissor me timbers.

(confidently)

Well, lest you misunderstood the situation, you're talking to Siofra Aine Whelan -

MILLIA

Do you do this with every tough woman you meet?

SIOFRA

Siofra Aine Whelan, student of Lakrym the Elvish hero, and formerly of the King's Elite Guard. I've slain dictators and lain dragons. I defended Labrysinnia from the Sedimented Golem Army using nothing more than a kiln and a toothpick. MILLIA

Is this a universal warrior thing? The introductory sword-measuring contest?

SUSAN

I'm quaking in my boots. I've cut down women with more fight in their eyes than you, without a second's hesitation. When you hear cattle whimpering in their fields at night it's a safe bet they know I passed overhead.

SIOFRA

It's funny you talk about cows. Your reputation says you fight no better than them. I, on the other hand, have matched enormous minotaurs in bare-fisted combat - I've cuckolded minotaurs in bare-fisted -

MILLIA

I hate this. I've never hated anything more than this.

SUSAN

You sex-obsessed joke of a knight.

SIOFRA

Disease-ridden sky-rat.

SUSAN

Tramp.

SIOFRA

Crook.

SIOFRA AND SUSAN (they begin to make kissy noises)

SUSAN

I'm going to kill you in your sleep.

SIOFRA

I'd like to see you try, you sniveling coward.

SUSAN

What did you plan on when you came to a pirate ship in the middle of nowhere?

(MORE)

SUSAN (CONT'D)

Are you one of those people who loves the idea of being captured and ravished by heartless criminals?

SIOFRA

I came to cut you pack hunters down like the dogs you are.

SUSAN

I'll make you heel.

MILLIA

Siofra, you make me wish I'd followed my father in his career and scooped dung for a living.

SUSAN

Cute kid. She yours?

SIOFRA

I've never seen her before in my life.

SUSAN

Keep her around. Life's more fun when you're pissing someone off. This is about this princess, isn't it?

MILLIA

Why would you think there's a princess afoot?

SUSAN

Because you wannabe social climbers keep using words like -afoot.Look, we know every criminal for hundreds of miles, of course we know about the princess.

MILLIA

Stay far away from her or Siofra will make you rue the day you were born.

SUSAN

Your threats need work. You know they're marrying her to someone she's never met for political purposes, right?

SIOFRA

Makes sense.

MILLIA

Wait, I thought they wouldn't tell you why she was here.

SIOFRA

It's the only non-occult explanation that leaps to mind. We're technically neutral soil, and the succession wars have been boiling on and off for generations. Why else would they sneak her out here? I'll bet you whoever they chose as the lucky royal spouse is skulking around right now too. They just have to stay alive until a legally binding ceremony and the wars will be settled.

SUSAN

For now, until some new yahoo wants his bloodline blessed. I think it's disgusting to see a girl in the prime of her life sold off to buy a few weeks of peace.

MILLIA

You're very noble. I bet you'll be happy to help her escape, and even collect a tidy ransom when you sell her back to her family - hrrk!

SUSAN

(insulted)

Ha ha ha. I was gonna play that part by ear. I might collect the ransom and then never return her. Siofra, if you want my knife removed from your squire's neck -

MILLIA

I wouldn't turn down the offer.

SUSAN

Here's how we're going to play this. I feel like a fight tonight. You get me the demons, I leave your precious princess to marry someone she barely knows. No demons, and your entire town will be slaughtered and your valuables smelted to make me a set of goldplated jewel-encrusted lingerie. SIOFRA

Alright. You'll get your demons. You know, the enemy of my enemy is my crush.

MILLIA

Friend.

SIOFRA

Friend.

MILLIA

(whispering)

Let's get out of here, Siofra.

SIOFRA

(whispering, schoolgirlish) I think she liked me!

6 SCENE 6 - MILLIA, SIOFRA

PASTORAL TOWN. SWORDS BEING SHARPENED.

NARRATOR-MILLIA

When we returned to Bedleham it quickly became clear that Susan's theory was right - the cathedral was surrounded by men with swords trying very hard to look inconspicuous. Siofra recognized many of them.

SIOFRA

Hey Carl. Steve. Sup Henrietta?

MILLIA

Bet you didn't expect to see so many of your old co-workers.

(beat)

Oh... Sorry. I guess I should have realized it wouldn't be that pleasant.

SIOFRA

Nah, it's not that. They just make me anxious. You ever been a leader, kid?

MILLIA

I was in charge of my scout troop's bake sales.

(MORE)

6

MILLIA (CONT'D)

Lot of paperwork, but thanks to some careful delegation we made it through.

SIOFRA

Huh. The thing about life-and-death struggles is everyone gets antsy because you don't know how much you can count on anyone, even in the Elite Guard. That's how come when there's a large group of people shooting at someone they all always miss. All the arrows flying everywhere throw off your focus. It's like a fundamental law of the universe. And don't get me started when they're ninjas. I was briefly put in charge of the Anaconda Unit -

MILLIA

Is that why you weren't worried about the pirates? Too many of them to fight properly?

SIOFRA

Yeah. It was just bad luck Susan was there. I heard she shattered a castle once with just one cannonball.

MILLIA

Was it an old castle?

SIOFRA

Yes, but what was alarming was she didn't need a cannon to throw it.

7 SCENE 7 - SIOFRA, MILLIA, SAJA, LORICK

ROARING FIRE

DOOR KNOCKING

SIOFRA

Let us in, we're with the band.

SAJA

(through a door)

Siofra!

LORICK

(through a door)

Princess, wait!

7

DOOR OPENING

SAJA

What news of the pirates?

SIOFRA

Taken care of.

LORICK

And you two without a scratch.

SIOFRA

Don't sound so disappointed.

LORICK

Next I want you to meet with the Prince of Tinderwood, whose caravan should be arriving soon. You will be staying with him tonight. Far from the princess.

SIOFRA

You know if the crown doesn't recognize me I don't really have to listen to you, right, pencil-neck?

LORICK

If you don't care about the peace process we will be enacting tonight-

SIOFRA

You mean the political marriage that you're doing a bad job keeping under wraps?

SAJA

Gosh, Siofra, you're as sharp as you are pretty.

SIOFRA

Shucks, 'tweren't nuthin'.

SAJA

Siofra will be my bodyguard tonight, Lorick. You can visit the Prince of Tinderwood and assess whether he will present a threat to my person.

LORICK

Your majesty, Siofra has proven on several occasions that she cannot be trusted.

8

SAJA

Thank you, Lorick. I don't wish for your company as I prepare for my wedding. That will be all.

LORICK

(extremely flustered)
Very well, Majesty.

DOOR OPENS, CLOSES.

8 SCENE 8 - SAJA, SIOFRA, MILLIA

ROARING FIRE

SAJA

Ha ha! What a twerp!

SIOFRA

Ah, I was probably just as annoying when I wore the royal crest.

SAJA

Not at all. I always wanted to grow up to be just like you. I was always too shy to say it but when I was alone in my room I took my curtain rod and pretended I was fighting monsters with you.

SIOFRA

I always wondered why the castle went through so many curtain rods.

MILLIA

Are you looking forward to the wedding?

SAJA

I guess so. It should ease some geopolitical tensions for a while.

MILLIA

Geopolitical tensions? This is your life.

SAJA

I am aware of that. Just as I am aware every time news reaches my father of more fatalities from fighting over his crown. The region needs something to unify it, and if I can help I have no choice.

SIOFRA

If so many people would oppose this marriage that you need to keep it a secret until it's done, who's to say it will change anything?

SAJA

Do you have any better ideas?

SIOFRA

Not a one.

MILLIA

So what are we doing about the demons, Siofra?

SAJA

There are demons afoot? Cooool!

SIOFRA

They're just these guys we know. Really not as exciting as they want you to think. The problem is finding them.

MILLIA

They're living at the lighthouse.

SIOFRA

How do you figure?

MILLIA

Nexus of magical energy, convenient to everywhere we've encountered them, stylish, ominous...

SIOFRA

I guess we'd better let the pirates know.

SAJA

You left the pirates alive?

SIOFRA

We made a deal so everyone can live. I'm sure you of all people understand where we're coming from.

SAJA

I suppose so.

(beat)

The Prince of Tinderwood isn't that bad. Sure, he's a jerk, but aren't most twelve-year-olds?

MILLIA

He's twelve?!

SAJA

You really don't understand political marriages, huh?

MILLIA

I really don't. Princess, you're stronger than I ever appreciated.

SAJA

Thank you. You know, when I was little I always dreamed people would tell me that. Not in these circumstances, of course. I should get dressed. And Siofra... I'm glad I got to see you one last time as a member of my own family. You were always my hero.

SIOFRA

It is an honor, your highness.

DOOR CLOSES.

PASTORAL TOWN

9 SCENE 9 - SIOFRA, MILLIA

SIOFRA
I guess it's time we let Susan know where her demons are. Assuming your guess holds true.

MILLIA

I hate everything about this situation. Poor Saja.

SIOFRA

She called me a hero.

(beat)

I guess that's life. We don't all get happy endings.

MILLIA

I almost wish the pirates would attack the wedding. Hey, Siofra, a horse could run on cobbled paths faster than those motorcycle things the demons use, right? 9

SIOFRA

I imagine, yes. Why?

MILLIA

Can you find me a horse before the wedding? I think I can solve everything.

SIOFRA

Wait, I think I see your idea. It's brilliant, Millia. You're such a genius I could kiss you. I just have one alteration.

10 SCENE 10 - SAJA, MILLIA

10

PASTORAL TOWN

DOOR OPENS

SAJA

Where's Siofra?

MILLIA

She's off getting to do the cool stuff. Like usual.

SAJA

The cool stuff?

MILLIA

Last-minute escapes and derring-do.

SAJA

She never let me go on her adventures either.

MILLIA

Of course, the more witnesses there are, the less she can talk up her bravery down the line.

SAJA

Is she a coward in private?

MILLIA

No, but I don't think anyone could live up to the reputation she wants. She was telling me today about someone who threw cannonballs barehanded.

SAJA

Was this a real person or a folklore thing?

MILLIA

That's the thing! I really never know with her!

11 SCENE 11 - MILLIA, LORICK, PRINCE

11

ROARING FIRE

NARRATOR-MILLIA

I spent much of that afternoon learning how to lace a corset. The princess was not accustomed to doing so herself. That's one thing about working with Siofra. Your CV overfloweth with bizarre skills. On the other side of the cathedral, Lorick was learning new things as well.

LORICK

... No, I couldn't tell you whether she's a good kisser. I suppose there won't be much kissing anyway. I'm led to understand political weddings involve a lot of concubines.

PRINCE

(a relatively sweet twelve year old boy)
That just seems rude.

LORICK

She'll have them too.

PRINCE

That's worse! Why can't we just form an alliance without all this?

LORICK

Because years down the line, who's to say there won't be a double-cross? This way, we can't strike without endangering our princess, and you can't strike without your wife being very upset about it.

PRINCE

I'll already be cheating on her.

LORICK

That's different. Peasants cheat when they're bored with people they married for love. You'll cheat so you don't get annoyed with someone you're trapped with.

PRINCE

Did you study negotiation as well as swordplay?

LORICK

I'm not even supposed to be quarding you...

12 SCENE 12 - MILLIA, HELENA, HAROLD

12

HEAVY WIND ON THE MOORS

NARRATOR-MILLIA

On the moors, Siofra was putting her plan into action, atop a chestnut steed I later learned she tamed in the woods. As I say, Siofra has a bizarre skillset indeed. But although we only discussed checking where the demons were, her horse made a low profile difficult.

HELENA

Harold.

HAROLD

(a biker chick with a
goofy man's name. Wants
to be a terrifying
supervillain but can't
quite hack it)

Helena. You return from town. What news?

HELENA

Something's going down. You might want to keep an eye out for Siofra today. I think there's a royal passing through.

HAROLD

The crown... Should we ransom a member of the King's family I daresay our entire purpose here would be simpler. What do you propose?

HELENA

Well, it's funny you ask that, as just out the window Siofra's ridden a horse into view. Something is -

HAROLD

Siofra? Here? Everyone! Get your swords! We shall slay the woman who humiliated me!

HELENA

I'll just, you know, stay here. In case you blow it again and still need a double agent.

HAROLD

Prepare to taste defeat, Siofra!

HORSE CLOPPING

13 SCENE 13 - SAJA, MILLIA, LORICK, PRINCE

WEDDING BELLS, ORGAN MUSIC

SAJA

Where is Siofra?

MILLIA

I'm beginning to wonder the same thing. She knows time is ticking.

LORICK

We're just driving up risk by waiting, whatever idiotic plan she had. Prince, are you ready for your big moment?

PRINCE

Is this meant to be good or bad? Make up your mind.

SHERIFF

Hello, all. As the law around these legally neutral parts, I'm going to be acting as your clergy. Is everyone present and accounted for?

MILLIA

Siofra's not here.

SHERIFF

Everyone who matters to the event?

SAJA

Here.

PRINCE

(like a schoolboy)

Present.

SHERIFF

Do we have the rings?

MILLIA

I hope she's okay, Saja. She's not usually this bad at timing. I know she'd want to be here for you.

SHERIFF

Dearly beloved, et cetera, et cetera, these two are going to get married and if you don't like it this is your last chance to say so. What do you vow?

SAJA

I vow to be faithful and tolerant and nice at all times.

PRINCE

I vow never to be a party to any attacks on your country as long as our marriage is healthy.

LORICK

(coughing)

PRINCE

And to... love and cherish you.

SAJA

Thank you. That means a lot to me.

SHERIFF

Very well. By the power vested in me by absolutely no one, and thank you so much for rubbing that in so much today, you are now...

HORSE HOOVES GALLOPING. ENGINES REVVING.

SAJA

What's that?

14 SCENE 14 - SIOFRA, LORICK, MILLIA

14

STAINED GLASS SHATTERS. A HORSE WHINNIES AND LANDS ON THE WOOD.

THE BELLS AND ORGAN MUSIC STOP. SILENCE.

SIOFRA

Heeyah! Get back to the woods with you!

HORSE TROTS AWAY

LORICK

What the devil is going on?

SIOFRA

Did I make it in on the -if anyone has any objection to this union-bit?

MILLIA

They weren't doing that part.

SIOFRA

Darn it. Cheaters.
I advise everyone to take cover. We will be attacked in quick succession by two different groups of armed maniacs but don't worry, they hate each other more than us.

MOTORCYCLES REV IN THE DISTANCE.

FOUR STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS SHATTER

15 SCENE 15 - SHERIFF, HAROLD, SUSAN

15

SHERIFF

Do these people realize that stained glass doesn't just grow back?!

HAROLD

Humans! I bet you thought you were rid of me, but whatever human rituals you use this isolated cathedral for will not be happening tonight!

AN AIRPLANE SWOOPS OVERHEAD

MORE STAINED GLASS WINDOWS SHATTER

SHERIFF

It's expensive glass! And the artists aren't easy to commission!

SUSAN

Onward, men! Pillage and - Harold!

HAROLD

Susan.

SUSAN

You humiliated me once. It shall not happen again.

16 SCENE 16 - SIOFRA, MILLIA, SAJA

16

A BATTLE ENSUES. ORGANS SMASH, PEOPLE YELL, SWORDS CLASH.

SIOFRA

Good job the only people who came were bodyguards. I'm glad just once before I died I got to see a wedding where every guest was armed. Reminds me of the stories my mother told me of her homeland. Of course, the only armed wedding guests there are the families of whichever spouse is pregnant.

MILLIA

It's amazing more people aren't dying gruesomely.

SIOFRA

I told you. The more people, the worse they fight. Anyway, I can't thank you enough. You're a genius, Millia, realizing the cathedral was far enough out of town that the demons could tread on this ground without breaking their word!

MILLIA

My plan was, check that the demons were at the lighthouse and escape on horseback before telling the pirates!

SIOFRA

Oh. That would have worked too.

MILLIA

What exactly is your plan?

SIOFRA

SUSAN

Harold. I expect you're still feeling pretty cool for attacking a crew of pirates in their sleep.

HAROLD

I've heard no complaints. Not from anyone I respect.

SUSAN

I guess you -are- the kind of wuss who surrounds yourself with yes-men.

HAROLD

What are you doing? Don't pick me up -

Demons! You see your boss? Fetch!
